St. Joseph's Home is a private, but state-funded home, providing nursing care and rehabilitation services for up to 125 children who suffer from chronic and debilitating illnesses.



In 2010 we will celebrate our 75th year of service to children with chronic illnesses. The year also marks the 75th year of dedicated service by the Pallottine Missionary Sisters.

This legacy of healing and commitment has given thousands upon thousands of children a second chance at a healthy childhood.

## Who we are

St. Joseph's Home was founded in 1935 by the Pallottine Missionary Sisters. The Home started off with ten children suffering from malnutrition and bone disease. Today, we care for upwards of 125 children. Our children suffer from Cancer, HIV/AIDS, Diabetes, organ failures, accidents, and other long-term chronic illnesses.

We have a Board of Directors who oversee the Home and report to the Pallottine Sisters. The children are cared for by professional nursing staff and therapists.

All children are referred to the Home for nursing care by various hospitals including The Red Cross Children's Hospital, Groote Schuur, Tygerberg, Somerset and Conradie. These hospitals serve children throughout the Cape Province and from the Eastern Cape.

## Your Support

St. Joseph's receives a government subsidy which covers a part of the cost of caring for our children. We are fortunate to receive donations from businesses, Foundations and friends. Without their support we would not be able to offer the holistic healing services we provide.



## What we do

The Home, governed by Christian values, provides a secure and homely environment in which the chronically ill or handicapped child can heal, learn and develop to his or her full potential.

This is achieved by treating the 'whole child' and not just the illness. In this way we promote overall physical, emotional, intellectual and spiritual development.

We also provide a short-term residence for parents, knowing that having one's Family around during medical treatment is a great comfort for child and parent.

Once the child's condition has been medically stabilized and the parents have learned how to care for their child, they return to their families and communities

## Our Services

We have over 100 staff striving to make a genuine difference in the health and development of the children we care for.

They provide five feeding periods a day 24/7, nursing care, dialysis services, Physio and Occupational services, formal education for children on site, recreational activities, parent accommodation, social work and a unique nurses training program.
